A Visit "below stairs" at Audley End House



What a treat we had on a wet October day exploring the workings of this stately home.

Most of us are familiar with life of the aristocracy from books and TV series like **Downton Abbey** and **Victoria.** But maintaining such a lavish life style required a large retinue of servants who worked long hours in the kitchen, laundry, gardens and stables etc.

Our tour began in the kitchen and laundry. Only later did we enter the main house to admire treasures such as Holbein and Canaletto, sit in the sumptuous library and drawing rooms, ending our visit in the Nursery where 8 children were nurtured.

Most of us do not connect domestic servants with our lives today, but we accept Eastern European cleaners /carers and delivery drivers dashing to deliver us takeaway meals; many of them working long hours on minimum wages with limited opportunities to control their own destinies.

If this makes us feel uncomfortable we need to remember that many Victorian servants may have been similarly treated but were better protected by those "upstairs" as they were looked after by their employees who made sure they were well fed and cared for while in their service. How they faired when this ended is debatable!
